Students heard performances by band and orchestra students and got a chance to see and hear each instrument played by our current 4th Graders. We will now begin the process of enrolling band and orchestra students for next school year. Please discuss today's assembly with your child to determine which instrument they would like to learn. All children are capable of learning to play an instrument, regardless of academic ability or musical background. Playing an instrument is a rewarding experience all the way through high school and beyond. Through playing in the band or orchestra, students learn discipline, teamwork, time management, and develop a committed work ethic and self-esteem.

Please complete the online sign-up form, even if your child is not interested in playing an instrument or undecided, by Friday, May 26th. *Students interested in playing percussion (bells/drums) must complete a tryout before the school year ends, and must also select a second choice instrument. More information on percussion tryouts will be sent after May 26th.*

After signing up, please begin the process of obtaining your child an instrument and the appropriate method books. We strongly encourage instrument rental from one of our "preferred vendors" listed on the next page. A brochure for each company is attached to this letter and website links can be found on the next page. These companies provide quality instruments and repair services, as well as music stands, method books, and accessories. They have a flat-fee trial period that will cover the price of instrument rental for the first few months and offer the opportunity to use accrued rental payments toward the future purchase of a new instrument.

After choosing which vendor works best for your family, please complete the rental contract/book order as soon as possible. We will begin lessons shortly after school resumes in the fall. If not renting, please contact a teacher prior to making a purchase. *Please do not purchase a low-cost new instrument online or at a discount store, as these instruments do not typically hold up well to student use and are often impossible (or very costly) to repair.* ***All violin, viola, and cello players must be measured by the rental vendor to select the proper sized instrument. Our preferred vendors are able to do this measurement for you.**

2023-24 Beginning Band/Orchestra FAQ:

- **How often will students have lessons?** Normally, students receive one half-hour lesson per week in small groups. Students are pulled out of other instruction for their lessons, but we make every effort to avoid core academic classes and rotate the times whenever possible. Students do not receive a grade in 4th grade, but are graded in 5th grade.
- **How much will my child be expected to practice at home?** Our weekly practice goal is 60 minutes, and this is easily attained by practicing 4 days a week for 15 minutes. We understand there will be times when students are unable to meet the goal, but encourage as much consistency as possible to help build skills and enhance enjoyment.
- **Can my child still participate in chorus if they play an instrument?** Chorus is offered in each school beginning in 4th grade, and we encourage all band and orchestra students to participate. There are no scheduling conflicts between band/orchestra and chorus, and singing is proven to help make learning an instrument easier!
- **My child will be in 5th Grade next year. Can he/she still begin playing an instrument?** Yes! We encourage students beginning as 5th graders to get a head start this summer by taking private lessons through one of the music stores listed below, and we will provide extra support to help them catch up to their classmates when school resumes this fall. Please contact a teacher for more information.
- **Will there be concerts?** Normally, our beginner musicians perform two concerts per year (December/May). This may change depending on circumstances and restrictions at the time, so more details will follow as we move through the year.
- **How long is my child expected to commit to playing their instrument?** We ask that all students commit to being part of the band or orchestra at least through the first half of the year. There may be periods of frustration as with anything new, and it may take a few months to really start to enjoy making music on an instrument. With patience, a positive attitude, and plenty of encouragement at home, we are confident that our young musicians will succeed and thrive!

Dear Hampton Elementary School Families:

Please pass the word along to your friends and family – 2023 Kindergarten registration has begun!

Information regarding Kindergarten registration will be published in the local paper and placed on the HTSD Website (www.ht-sd.org). In the meantime, please spread the word to neighbors who may be new in the community or to those without children currently enrolled in the Hampton Elementary Schools. Registering on time is important so that the District can plan appropriately for the number of students who will be attending school in the fall.

Registration for Kindergarten and any first-grade students new to Hampton Schools will take place virtually. To register, please access the HTSD website www.ht-sd.org. Within the District tab, click the "About" Tab. Access the "Moving to Hampton" tab. Once there, families will find instructions for 2023 Kindergarten registrations under "Register My Child." Upload completed packets and documentation to the appropriate elementary school.

All families are encouraged to complete the online registration process by February 3rd.

Children ready to enter Kindergarten should be five years old by August 15, 2023. First graders should be six years old by August 15, 2023. A birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of birth and proof of Hampton residency (closing papers, lease agreement, rent receipt or residency form AND utility bill, cable bill, paid wage tax receipt, driver's license, guardianship form, or court order) are necessary before children can be enrolled. Proof of immunization is necessary as well.

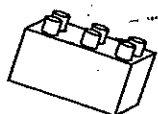
Parents of children who do not meet the above-mentioned age requirements must submit a written request for early admission to the building principal by April 15, 2023. This request should state reasons why early admission to school is appropriate for the child, including information and test data from the school(s) he or she may have attended previously. Admission will be based upon the recommendation of the school in which the student seeks enrollment and the authorization of the Principal and Superintendent.

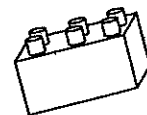

LEGO: In this 4 day summer program, students entering Grades 3-6 will work to complete daily building challenges. Some challenges may include building famous landmarks, building the longest (and strongest) bridge, building the tallest structure etc... Participants may also simply choose to "free build" or create designs from their own imagination.

This camp will be held at Poff Elementary School and will run from 10:00am-11:30am, MONDAY-THURSDAY. Last year's sessions both filled up, so I will be adding a third week this summer. The first session will be held June 19-22, the second session will be held June 26-29, and the third session will be held July 10-13. Please choose a session below. 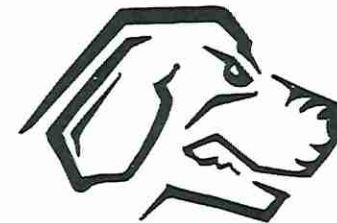

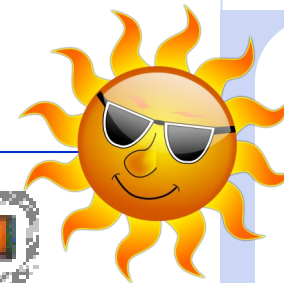
